Reminder

Two recommendations and your high school transcript* (through grade 10 only) are to be submitted. One recommender must be a teacher at your school. The other can be any non-relative who knows you well (including another school professional, Rabbi, employer, etc.).

The deadline for submitting your application: December 4, 2023.

Final deadline for receipt of recommendations and transcript: December 6, 2023.

It is important to request your recommendations and transcript far in advance of the deadline.

*We request academic transcripts to learn about an applicant's academic pursuits and course load. However, we do not believe that grades and GPA reflect a candidate's sophistication of thought, character, or the ability to contribute to and benefit from the Fellowship. Far more important (and interesting) are the personal essays and letters of recommendation, which offer a platform for applicants to tell their stories, express their unique interests, and describe their relationship to community.

Finalists will be notified in **mid-January**. Interviews for finalists will take place in person in **February**. Fellows will be notified of acceptance in **early March**.
